Year 3 Stone Age Home Learning Autumn Term 1 2023


Each week you will be given 3 activities that <u>must</u> be done. We have then given you 6 activities to choose from and would like you to complete at least 1 of these activities over the term. These are not compulsory but will help you with your understanding of our topic this term. Optional homework will be shared with the rest of the class and rewarded with a gold coin for your house team.

MUST DO activities (weekly)	Reading 3 x per week Remember to record your reading in your reading record 3 times per week to receive a flying high award at the end of term.	Spellings Practise your weekly spellings ready for your test – see if you can put the words into a sentence.	Timetables Rehearse and practise your x tables as often as you can. By the end of year 3 you need to know the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times table.
Could Do Activities (please choose at least 1 of these activities to complete over the term)	Stone Age Animals Research some of the animals that lived in the Stone Age and create a fact file about them. This could be presented as a poster, PowerPoint (emailed to school), leaflet or one of your own ideas.	Family Day Out Go on a family visit to Stonehenge and take some photographs, bring back some information or write a recount of your visit to share with the class.	Make Stone Age Fruit Stew Follow the Stone Age Stewed Fruit recipe (attached with this homework grid) and test it with your family. Get some feedback from each of your family members and come and share your thoughts with the class.
	Become a Hunter Gatherer It's the perfect time of year to go for a forage in the country side. See what delicious things you can find to eat in the wild. There may be some berries, flowers, herbs, or you might even go and catch some fish in the River Avon! Come and share what you found on your foraging quest.	Woodwork Modern Day tools have really come on since they were first designed in the Stone Age but some are still quite similar. With help from an adult have a go at using some tools and seeing what you can make. You might try a saw, hammer, file, screwdriver or anything else in the toolbox. Don't forget to bring in your creations.	Design a Stone Age Outfit. Design an outfit for a Stone Age girl or boy. Think carefully about what fabrics they used to make their clothes. You might be able to find some materials at the local fabric store to collage your design or if you're good at sewing you might even be able to make it into a real garment!



STONE AGE

Stewed Fruit Recipe



You will need...
500g blueberries
500g blackberries
200g hazelnuts
6 tbsp honeycomb

a large pan wooden spoon a ladle table spoon

a stove



- Add the blueberries to the pan.
- Add the blackberries to the blueberries. Using a wooden spoon mix them together - make sure you do this gently so you don't crush the fruit.
- ω Add the hazelnuts and carefully mix it all together.
- Add the honeycomb and transfer the pan to the stove (you might need to ask an adult for help with this). Bring the mixture gently to the boil.
- Simmer the mixture very carefully for 20mins. Leave to cool then transfer to a serving bowl.
