Uniform

T-shirt and / or plain hoodie in your child's team colour (purple, red, green or blue)

Plain (not branded) black shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings.

Jewellery and fancy hair accessories should not be worn for school and long hair should be tied back.

Keeping your child off school

As a school we want children to be in school as much as possible but on occasions when your child is ill we must stick to certain rules – especially when it comes to sickness bugs and other childhood illnesses. Please see the attached poster which indicates the required time off for specific illnesses. We also have a child in school at present who has a severally reduced immune system so we request that school are notified if any children are attending with childhood illnesses that do not require time off school – this will allow us to notify the family and allow them to make informed choices as to whether their child is safe to attend.
