<b>Export</b>	To export products or raw materials means to sell them to another country
<b>Fairtrade</b>	Trade between companies in developed countries and producers in developing countries in which fair prices are paid to the producers
<b>Globalisation</b>	Something that happens in all parts of the world or affects all parts of the world
<b>Global Supply Chain</b>	The entire process of making and selling goods including every stage from the supplying of materials and the manufacture of the goods through to their distribution and sale
<b>Import</b>	To import products or raw materials means to buy them from another country for use in your country
<b>Trade</b>	The activity of buying, selling or exchanging goods or services
<b>Trade Route</b>	A route, often covering long distances, that is used by traders
