Research merchandise which has been sold in previous games. What sells well and why? After designing your clothing/merchandise you could make your item. Take of photo of the finished product and post it to Seesaw. Choreograph a dance to perform at the opening / closing ceremony of a sporting event. Think about the music that the dance will be performed to. What type of mood do you want to portray? How do you want to make people feel? You may want to look at performances from opening/closing ceremonies to get some inspiration. Are their performances linked to the culture of their country?	ARE YOU READY FOR A SUMMER OF SPORT? Plan and record a video guide to teach others about your favourite sport. This could be a sport which you play yourself or one that you would like to try. If it is a sport that you've never played before, you may need to do some research beforehand. Think about what makes a good video guide. What types of thing do you like to watch? When you've create your video we would love to see it ARE YOU READY FOR A SUMMER OF SPORT? Make a list of objects / artefacts that could appear in an Olympic museum. You could include Usain Bolt's running shoes, Andy Murray's tennis racket which won him a gold medal in 2012 or how about an Olympic torch? Explain why you have chosen the objects that you have.
